RE: Palestine Needs Justice Now More Than Ever

Dear Mr. Karim Khan,

On the 9th anniversary of the referral of crimes committed in Palestine to the International Criminal Court, we, the undersigned scholars, experts, members of parliament and human rights organisations, urge you, as the Public Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, to address the ongoing breaches of international humanitarian law committed by the state of Israel against Palestinians living under its occupation.

Many of us had hoped that the ICC investigation, started under your predecessor, would continue under your leadership. However, despite mounting evidence of crimes committed by the Israeli regime, your office has apparently taken no further action.

The government of Palestine had first called for an ICC probe into allegations of crimes "in the occupied Palestinian territory, including East Jerusalem, since June 13, 2014", and became party to the Rome statute on 1 April 2015. On March 3, 2021, the former Prosecutor announced the opening of an investigation into the situation of Palestine. This followed the Pre-Trial Chamber's decision on February 5, 2021, providing that the court territorial jurisdiction extends to Gaza and West Bank, including East Jerusalem.

Since you assumed the position as the **Chief Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court**, no one heard anything from you on the Palestinian case, while your office announced speedy investigations into the alleged war crimes committed by Russia during its ongoing war against Ukraine, and issued an arrest warrant for President of Russia Vladimir Putin.

Last May, Palestinians commemorated 75 years of Nakba (the Catastrophe), during which Zionists committed several horrendous crimes against the Palestinians, including mass massacres and house demolition, however, all those crimes went unpunished.

Palestinians now are worried of being subjected to the same incidents of 1948, as the current situations they are witnessing are similar to that of the Nakba.

Crimes like the systematic killing of civilians, ongoing building of settlements, collective punishment, open-ended occupation, laws targeting only Palestinians, the state-backed seizure of Palestinian land by settlers and the regular targeting of civilian infrastructure by bulldozers in the West Bank, and advanced missiles in Gaza continue without repercussions.

The far-right government of Benjamin Netanyahu –already under fire by Israelis themselves– has increased the state's attacks on Palestinians as a means to boost his public approval.

In March, Israeli Finance Minister, Bezalel Smotrich, called for the Palestinian village of Hawara to be "wiped out" by the Israeli government. His comments followed what one IDF official called a "pogrom" in the village, where settlers killed one Palestinian, injured dozen and torched multiple homes.

In a speech during his visit to Franc, the same minister denied the existence of a Palestinian people," there is no such thing as a Palestinian People", indeed this is a very dangerous statement from a high official level paving the way for terrible crimes to take place.

The newly proposed Israeli government legislation would allow Palestinian prisoners to be executed – a clearly racist bill targeting only those living under occupation, who would be tried under a legal system that denies Palestinians the same rights as Israeli Jews.

On March 21, 2023, the Israeli parliament abolished the "disengagement" law enacted in 2015 to evacuate settlements in the Gaza Strip and four settlements in the northern West Bank. Abolishing this law would allow the rebuilding of the four settlements, hence annexing the whole of the West Bank.

This year has been marked as the deadliest yet, with the death toll reaching at least 145, including 28 children. This grim figure follows the 223 fatalities from 2022, with children making up 49 of the victims. This consistent pattern of violence against Palestinians by the Israeli Occupation Forces highlights a worrying trend that has been apparent since Palestine fell under the jurisdiction of the court in June 2014, with hundreds of Palestinians losing their lives or suffering injuries.

These disturbing statistics became even more concerning with the recent Israeli aggression in Gaza. The human toll of these actions was shocking: 33 lives were lost, including 6 children and 4 women, as reported by the Gaza Health Ministry and the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). The ripple effects of this aggression extended beyond these fatalities, causing varying degrees of injuries to an additional 190 Palestinians. The injured include a particularly vulnerable population: 64 children, 38 women, and 10 elderly individuals.

However, the violence has left more than just a human toll. The incessant attacks have also brought about widespread destruction, rendering approximately 1,000 Palestinians homeless. The effects on housing have been disastrous: around 2,800 units have suffered damage, with 140 completely flattened and another 128 rendered uninhabitable. Despite this, 1,820 damaged units are still deemed habitable. Altogether, the total number of partially damaged residences is a staggering 1,948, underscoring the devastating physical impact of this conflict alongside its horrific human cost.

Yet there has been no response to these horrific crimes from the ICC.

In announcing the investigation into alleged crimes in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, the ICC gave hope to those in Palestine that it would grant them a fair hearing on the global stage. However, given this standstill situation and with no actions being taken, those hopes have vanished.

We call on you to uphold the basic ideas of establishing a permanent international court to eliminate the spread phenomenon of impunity in serious crimes.

We urge you to have a bold and courageous stance against the world's powers, such as the US and the UK, in their attempts to discredit and oppose your investigation. Ironically, meanwhile these powers support ICC investigation in other situations including Ukraine!

We hereby demand that Palestinians are granted the same right to life and freedom as those in Ukraine and other areas under your jurisdiction.

There can be no more delays. Every day more rights are breached, more lives are taken, and more territory is seized.

We are looking forward to hearing from you.
